

He was a people's bishop, a shepherd to the true sense of the word. His simplicity and humility attracted every person who came to know him cutting across religions, caste and social status. The Director of SIGN always enjoyed a personal relationship with him and that possibly resulted in God's designing an intimate conversation between them at the last moments of his life on earth. ## "Social & Community Mobilization for Improving Child Health through Health System Strengthening"



Social Initiatives for Growth and Networking (SIGN), Ranchi implementing "Social & Community Mobilization for Improving Child Health through Health system Strengthening" is engaged in Mother and Child Health connecting communities with the benefits offered by the government health facilities in the five high priority districts of Jharkhand i.e. Pakur, Sahebganj, Palamu, Latehar and West Singhbhum covering 72 Panchayats and 600 villages with 481 VHND centres.

## STATE LEVEL CAPACITY BUILDING

The project staffs were sensitized about the project components in their own districts and then were given an intensive training at the State level from 22nd to 24th August 2018 at Social Development Center (SDC) Ranchi. The inputs were on child health issues; immunization schedule and services through VHND; nutrition and kitchen garden; inter personal communication skills and the various aspects of social and behavior change communication.

#### **VILLAGE VOLUNTEERS TRAINING**

**SIGN** integrated the concept of volunteerism into the intervention and has selected 1200 volunteers, 2 each from the 600 project villages. 870 have been already trained at the block level on **immunization** and its schedule, **VHND**, **Diarrhoea**, **pneumonia** and topics related to Child health especially nutrition and nutrition garden. They are supporting the project staff and the front line workers in the VHND as well as in the village community in all the activities.



## **ONE DAY SCHOOL HEALTH EDUCATION**



one day school health education was conducted in 75 schools for 15375 students on healthy practices like proper hand washing with soap, cleanliness and hygiene and safe drinking water etc. The trained teachers are following up the children.

## **RALLIES ON SPECIAL HEALTH DAYS**

Rallies are a collective way of promoting and educating people on something important. To create awareness on child health SIGN has conducted 16 Rallies on special health days in the project areas. Children, students, SHG and community members took part in these rallies. Slogans, placards on RI child health care were used to generate awareness among the people.

A total of 1277 participated during in these rallies.



## TRAINING SCHOOL TEACHERS ON CHILD HEALTH BEHAVIOURS



eachers play an role important in imparting knowledge and skills to students. They shape the future of every under their care. child SIGN, trained 583 school teachers from 75 schools on healthy practices concerning personal hygiene, child health and importance of vaccination.

## TRAINING OF SHG & GRAM SABHA MEMBERS

he SHGs have always proved to be a better change agent within the community especially

among women folk. 800 active SHG women were identified from the 600 project villages.

They were given training on the importance of RI, VHND an important platform to access Government Health Services, Diarrhea, and their role in motivating the village community.

They were also given training on Kangaroo Mother Care and the importance of breast feeding for a new born baby.



## Food Self Reliance and Livelihood Resilience Practices, Through Integrated Livelihood Initiatives and NRM



SIGN through its project "Food Self Reliance and Livelihood Resilience Practices through Integrated Livelihood Initiatives and Natural Resources Management has initiated the formation of Kisan Clubs across the 9 partners' area and their training motivating them to bring quality changes into all their agricultural activities.





State level FARMERS' MEET was held on 25th October, 2018 at Social Development center, Ranchi. Dr. Parvinder Kaushal, the Vice Chancellor of the Birsa Agricultural University (BAU) Ranchi, chaired the meeting while Dr. Prashant Kumar Verma, agriculture scientist, KVK, Holy cross, Hazaribag, was the main resource person. The President of SIGN, Most Rev. Felix Toppo S.J. too graced the stage and delivered a message. 150 farmers, the Partner Directors and representatives from other NGOs too took part in the meeting.

Dr. Parvinder Kaushal, chief guest motivated the farmers to engage in seasonal vegetable cultivation along with the traditional rain fed cultivation while Dr. Prashant Kumar Verma, emphasized on "The Role of farmers club in sustainable agriculture". The farmers too shared their experience in a panel session and open floor discussion.

## **OVER ALL IMPACT OF THE PROJECT**



- 1268 farmers' clubs have been formed consisting of 17232 members
- 1558 office bearers of the farmers' clubs have been given training in 27 batches
- 441 Krishak Mitras too were given special trainings in 10 batches
- Networking has been accomplished with 11 districts ATMA Project Directors by sharing the
  project strategies and other nuances seeking their support to the Kisan Clubs.
- 138 famers have cultivated paddy through SRI methods in 26.79 acres
- 337 farmers have cultivated vegetables in 103.3 acres
- **152 farmers** have cultivated maize in 25.73 acres
- 129 farmers have cultivated wheat in 26.5 acres
- 126 farmers have ensured kitchen garden for better nutrition practices
- 234 farmers have done cash crop in 80.95 acres to strengthen the family economic condition
- 138 farmers have done animal husbandry to ensure integrated farming
- 56 farmers have done fishery

## "STRENGTHENING EFFORTS AND CAPACITATING PARENTS OF POOR CHILDREN ON AGRICULTURAL AND LIVELIHOOD PRACTICES IN RURAL JHARKHAND."



The Project "Strengthening Efforts and Capacitating Parents of Poor Children on Agricultural and Livelihood Practices in Rural Jharkhand" began as a pilot intervention in the month of January 2018. It is a novel concept integrating the same with the ongoing sponsorship support to poor children. 1753 farmers from 32 villages in the districts of Ranchi, Khunti, Gumla. Simdega and Lohardaga are given training. Through community centric approach farmers are trained in their own villages, or cluster of villages, or in the place of the partner on quality agriculture and other livelihood options as well as on the concept of saving for the education of their children. Changes are already seen because of the intervention and the parents are understanding the fact that they should come out of dependency in supporting the education of their children. It is a process.

## **MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS 2018-2019**



- 1753 farmers are trained in quality agriculture
- **70 farmers** took first attempt to cultivate tomato in rainy season.
- 350 families got motivated and started kitchen Garden systematically.
- **883 farmers** were already having piggery farm out of which 10 percent framers have started to have piggery in a proper manner.
- 175 new families opened savings account in bank for their children's higher education.
- **350 farmers** were already doing horticulture and have learned the importance of horticulture: 210 trees are planted.
- **525 farmers** agreed for organizing Kisan Clubs for agricultural activities and sorting out agricultural problems.

## 'AWAKENING THE TRIBAL SOUL'

**SIGN** has been spearheading the very innovative program for last many years named 'Awakening the Tribal Soul' to its rich heritage and traditions. The initiative was taken further to gather the imbedded values and wisdom of the ancestral tribal mind under the theme 'Resilient tribal communities and leadership as enshrined in the wisdom of the community traditions and as reflected in Laudato Si'. SIGN conducted 22 one-day workshops across Jharkhand on the theme and again 8 two-day workshops on "Integral Ecology for Tribal Unity' in collaboration with the partners covering more than 1600 community leaders.



## STANDARD TREATMENT GUIDELINES (STG)

SIGN conducted a workshop for the health personnel of Jharkhand coming from the 9 partners' areas to reflect on the need and possibility of bringing out the 3rd edition of Standard Treatment Guidelines



(STG). The effort of SIGN to support the Nurse Sisters working in the rural areas has been noteworthy especially through the publication of the STG and other training programs. A decision was taken to bring out the 3rd edition of STG in June 2019.

SIGN supported the Samaj Vikas Sanstha (SVS), Chandwa to form Saheli Sangathans among adolescent Girls under the umbrella of adolescent Health as well as to conduct trainings for the 1375 members of the 114 Saheli Sangathan in Latehar and Palamau Districts. Support was also extended for special trainings for the leaders of the groups.

## **DISTRIBUTION OF MOSQUITO NETS**



Distribution of mosquito nets in the associated study homes for girls & boys of the faith based organizations across Jharkhand has been going on with the view of teaching children to use mosquito nets and thus combat the menace of malaria. The presumed implication is that these children, in turn, will educate their parents too, on the importance of using mosquito nets as a preventive measure. This financial year too, **3584** nets were distributed in Dumka partner's area of operation taking the total distribution to **30501**.

## **EDUCATION SUPPORT TO CHILDREN**



The SIGN has been supporting 43 centres towards the education of 1698 children directly and many other poor children within the financial possibility of the centre in the districts of Ranchi, Lohardaga, Khunti, Simdega and Gumla. 17 partners collaborate in this important intervention. Work is also being carried out through the Marianist Trust among the slum children of Ranchi. Many children are in the schools and are able to make a life for themselves. The project is also targeting the empowerment of the parents through trainings in agriculture and other livelihood options.

## STORIES OF CHANGE

Mr. Sumit Bhengra, age 24 belongs to Churgi village of Diyankel Panchayat in Khunti District, Jharkhand. Financial situation at home forced him to give up his studies after intermediate. He was a dejected young man.

However, he received some inspiration from his hard working father, Mr. Philip Bhengra who was engaged in the family fields. It was then that Sumit received an opportunity to attend training on improved Agriculture organized by the partner Hoffmann Social Service Society, Khunti supported by SIGN.

Sumit picked up courage inspired by the training and managed to get on loan a capital of Rs. 2 lacs. He risked the capital on the cultivation of watermelon in 12 acres of land taken from other farmers. As the crop was ready he managed to sell the produce in the market and earn an income of Rs 5 lacs. Loan paid off and now he is the master of his life. Dejection has turned into hope. He has now widened the possibilities by cultivating market driven seasonal vegetables, engaging in animal husbandry, fishery, horticulture etc. He is a source of inspiration for youngsters like him.






Mrs. Sweeta Kujur, a house wife from Mahuatoli village of Samlong, Namkom, Ranchi, partner attended the livelihood capacity enhancement training conducted at Mahuatoli. Her husband works as a daily labourer



and the income hardly meets the daily needs. Sweeta was deeply motivated by the training. She decided to start a tea and snack stall near her house and explore the possibility of making some income for the family. She made a small investment and as planned, started the tea & snack stall near her house, where she is spending only three to four hours a day and is earning Rs.80-120 per day. She also decided to engage in animal husbandry activities. She has four pigs and piglets and she hopes that these too will give some profit in the days to come. A small start but a big leap in their humble life.

## **KISHANS REALIZED THEIR WORTH**

Koenjara Gajutoli village comes in Kasira Panchayat of Gumla block and District. Each individual farmer was cultivating traditional paddy and attempted too in some vegetable cultivation. Open grazing, lack of irrigation possibilities and the general apathy of others did not motivate them. Many of them migrated in search of menial jobs especially during the lean season.

The villagers were visited by staffs of SIGN, Ranchi and Gram Utthan Kendra, Gumla and then on a feasible day a meeting was organized in the village. The concept of Kisan Club, which has been launched by SIGN, was discussed in the meeting. The farmers were enthused with the concept and a training was conducted later to give them sufficient knowledge on the Kisan Club and quality agriculture. This gave birth to the formation of 2 farmers' clubs namely Adivasi Kisan club and Pragaty Kisan club. Young and old have come together to bring about change in their life.

They hold meeting every month, maintain the required registers and discuss issues concerning agriculture and the development of the village. The realization that collective farming in the available land of all the members of the clubs and exploring the possibilities of irrigation is vital for transforming the village inspired and motivated them. They joined hands together and for the first time in the history of the village, the farmers checked the rivulet flowing through the village to the river Koel, decided on guided pasturing of cattle and engaging in cultivation of seasonal vegetables as per the market demand. Today, acres and acres of land is cultivated making almost a green revolution. ATMA and other government departments have come to their aid by supplying seeds and other requirements. Kisans have realized their worth being in Kisan Club.

### A NEW OUTLOOK OF PAHARIA PRIMITIVE TRIBES



"You scared us with your visits intruding into our peaceful existence. We lived without vaccination and "why now" was the question on our uppermost mind. You persisted until we realized that vaccination is very important for healthy life. Thank you and now we are not scared."

The Paharia Tribe resisted vaccination and they found it irrelevant for their life. Their ancestors lived and died without vaccination and they too have lived so far. The community was not willing to see a difference between a healthy living and just living. However, Mrs. Jyoti K. Besra community mobilizer of Amrapara Block was determined to bring a change in their life. She visited them regularly and tried to hold meetings with the women and other stakeholders. It was a herculean task. The villagers had no idea about immunization and Mother and Child Health. The worst was their lack of interest and apathy. The community mobilizer changed her strategy by targeting just Nunpara village. She visited the village regularly but found it very hard to gather the villagers for a meeting. She took to interpersonal communication and held interactions with individual mothers in their own houses. The method worked and she was able to build personal relationship. She could gradually gather the mothers for a meeting. The input sessions given within their context began to bring some changes. They realized the importance of immunization and began to visit the VHND. Life changed for them and the community mobilizer's effort bore fruit. A lady from Nunpara, Mangli Paharin said the following to community Moblizer, Mrs. Jyoti Besra:

"You scared us with your visits intruding into our peaceful existence. We lived without vaccination and why now was the question on our uppermost mind. You persisted until we realized that vaccination is very important for healthy living. Thank you and now we are not scared."


