One-day workshop on Tribal Philosophy and Gram Sabha: In the rush towards

modern development, discussion of tribal tribal heritage or philosophy are often dismissed as outdated. However, as the planet warmer getting and warmer every day in and every day out and people suffering from



extreme heat, polluted air and contaminated water, present day intellectuals and scientists worldwide are turning their attention to the profound insights of tribal philosophy, value system and ways of leading life.



Against this background, SIGN has taken the challenge of revisiting Tribal Philosophy, tribal customs, traditional practices, tribal value system and tribal self-governance system. During the month SIGN organized 117wrokshops on Tribal Philosophy and Traditional Self-Governance system in 117 villages of Seven Districts viz. Ranchi, Lohardaga, Gumla, Simdega, Latehar and Garwah in Jharkhand. In the

workshop SIGN discussed the components of tribal philosophy viz. a) Co-existence with the nature, b) Communitarian Living, c) Equality living d) Autonomy e) (Self) Governance system f) Self-reliance, g) Mutual Support, h) Honesty, i) Self-Respect j) Fearlessness and k) Respecting the rights of others. While discussing about

Traditional Self-Governance system, it was said that it is need of the hour that every tribal should know that the traditional Self-governance system i.e., Gram Sabha is the best



system to bring peace in the community. It also unites and brings a sense of belongingness in the community. Because the traditional Self-Governance system runs according to collective thinking. The post of village head is hereditary, but if the village head in not qualified, that is, he is drunkard, a lunatic, a criminal, a mental patient, he can be removed. Youth are unaware of all these and so it is any eye opening of them. These workshops are quite beneficial for them and whole of villagers at large. Through

this Project, people have started understanding the greatness of tribal philosophy and importance of traditional Self-Governance system.
